Being unfit for service overseas, I was sent to Vancouver B.C., Washington. My services being required to help get spruce out of the big woods, used in the making of aircraft. I was one of the 40th Spruce Sq; afterward stationed at Port Angeles, Wash; on construction work, in preparation to getting the spruce out, and was still stationed there when the armistice was signed.

I believe I belong to the Malcolm White Post no 433, having filled out application when post was first detached
