Enlisted in R.O.T.C. Plattsburg May 1917 in the Infantry
Transferred to the Cavalry on account of former service in this arm in the National Guard, June 1917.
Commissioned 2nd Lieutenant, Quartermaster Corps, August 1917.
Assigned to divisional headquarters staff, 77th Division at Camp Upton, as Assistant to the Division Quartermaster, September 1917.
Promoted First Lieutenant, March 1918.
Served in the British Expeditionary Forces, Pas de Calais, May-June 1918. A.E.F. in the
Served in the Defensive Sector of Lorraine June-August 1918.
Recommended for promotion.
Served in the oise-Aisne Offensive August 1918. Ordered to the United States as Instructor with one of the new divisions with a promotion of one grade.
Served at Camp Meade as Assistant to the Division Quartermaster of the 11 Division September-1918-January 1919. Promoted to Captain.
Honorably discharged January 1919.
