EVACUATION "GO-BAG"

Every household should pack a Go-Bag, a collection of items you may need in the event of an evacuation. A Go-Bag should be packed in a sturdy, easy-to-carry container such as a backpack or suitcase on wheels and should be easily accessible if you have to leave your home in a hurry. Make sure it is ready to go at all times of the year.

Suggested Items include:

- Copies of important documents (Credit/ATM Card and Cash in a waterproof container insurance cards, birth certificates, deeds, photo IDs, etc.)
- Extra sets of car/house keys
- Bottled water, non-perishable food, energy bars
- Flashlight, rain gear & mylar blanket
- Battery-operated AM/FM radio & extra batteries
- List of doctors, at least 3-day supply of medications
- First-aid kit
- Child care, pet care, & other special items
- Contact & meeting place information for your household, & small regional map

Everyone in your home should work together to make an emergency plan, gather supplies, and understand the hazards they may face.

NOTIFY ME® EMERGENCY ALERTS

We recommend you sign-up for Notify Me® Alerts at www.southamptontownny.gov/NotifyMe This system allows you to receive a text message or email from our Emergency Alerts systems. **Information includes:** evacuations, shelters, situation reports, emergency weather conditions, local flooding, road closures due to accidents or road work and closures of Town facilities. SENIORS/SPECIAL NEEDS RESIDENTS

Shelter space is available, but limited and based on need: You must pre-register with the Town's Senior Services/Special Needs Office 631-728-1235

SPECIAL NEEDS TRANSPORTATION ONLY

If you do not qualify for the special needs program and need transportation **ONLY** to a regular shelter, the Town will provide transportation, but you must pre-register, live in an evacuation zone or mobile/manufactured home, be physically handicapped, or have no other means of transportation.

HOUSEHOLD DISASTER PLAN

Develop and practice a disaster plan with your household members to prepare for what to do, how to find each other, and how to communicate in an emergency.

Decide where your household members will reunite after a disaster. Identify two places: one near your home, and another outside your immediate neighborhood.

Practice using all possible exit routes from your home and neighborhood.

Designate an out-of-state friend or relative who household members can call if separated during a disaster. If local phone circuits are busy, long-distance calls or texting may be easier to make. This out-of-state contact can help you communicate with others.

Plan for everybody's needs, especially seniors, non-English-speakers, people with disabilities, children, and pets.

Buy the right insurance: Homeowners make sure your home is properly insured – flood and wind damage are not covered in a basic homeowner's policy. Renter's insurance will insure the items inside your home.

HOUSEHOLD EMERGENCY SUPPLIES KIT

An emergency supplies kit is simply a collection of basic items your household may need in the event of an emergency.

Keep enough supplies in your home to survive for at least 10-15 days. Suggested items are available at www.ready.gov/build-a-kit

Suggested items include:

- Water, one gallon of water per person per day for at least three days, for drinking and sanitation
- Food, at least a 3-day supply of non-perishable food
- Infant formula and diapers
- Pet food and extra water for your pet
- Battery-powered radio and extra batteries
- Fully fuel your vehicles and propane tanks
- Flashlight and extra batteries
- Mobile Phone battery charger and car charger
- First aid kit
- A whistle to signal for help
- Dust mask, plastic sheeting, duct tape
- Moist towelettes, garbage bags and plastic ties for personal sanitation
- Wrench or pliers to turn off utilities
- Can opener for food (if kit contains canned food)
- Local maps
- Cash, copies of ATM & credit cards
