RESCISSION OF EMERGENCY DESIGNATION OF SHELLFISH LANDS IN THE STATE OF NEW YORK AS UNCERTIFIED FOR THE HARVEST OF SHELLFISH

Pursuant to the provisions of Subdivisions 13-0307 (1) and (2) and Subdivision 13-0309 (1) of the Environmental Conservation Law and Sections 42.17 and 47.4 of Title 6 of the Official Compilation of Codes, Rules and Regulations of the State of New York, and based upon the determination that conditions that may cause shellfish to be hazardous for use as food are no longer present, I, Debra A. Barnes, Chief of the Bureau of Shellfisheries of the Department of Environmental Conservation, hereby rescind the order, dated October 12, 2018, that designated particular shellfish lands as uncertified for the harvest of shellfish. This order is effective at sunrise on **Wednesday, October 17, 2018** and applies only to the areas described below.

Accordingly, the harvest of shellfish from the following areas is permitted:

Towns of Babylon and Islip: All the normally certified areas in Great South Bay lying westerly of the Oak Island boat channel.

Town of Islip: All the normally certified areas in northern Great South Bay lying east of the northbound span of the Robert Moses causeway AND west of line extending southerly from Nicoll Point to buoy R "4" FL R 2.5s and then continuing southerly to the northwestern corner of the structure surrounding the Point O' Woods boat basin.


Town of Brookhaven: All the normally certified areas of Bellport Bay lying easterly of a line extending southerly from Howells Point to buoy G "1" FL G 2.5s and then continuing southerly to the flag tower at Bellport Beach on Fire Island.

Town of Southampton: All the normally certified areas in Red Creek Pond and Squire Pond.

Note: All that area of Great South Bay lying east of the Oak Island boat channel and west of the northbound span of the Robert Moses causeway; AND, all those areas of northern Nicoll Bay and Patchogue Bay; AND, all that area of Flanders Bay, that were designated as uncertified on October 12, 2018, remain uncertified and the harvest of shellfish in those areas is prohibited.
