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RESCISSION OF EMERGENCY DESIGNATION OF SHELLFISH LANDS IN THE STATE OF NEW YORK AS UNCERTIFIED FOR THE HARVEST OF SHELLFISH

Pursuant to the provisions of Subdivisions 13-0307 (1) and (2) and Subdivision 13-0309 (1) of the Environmental Conservation Law and Sections 42.17 and 47.4 of Title 6 of the Official Compilation of Codes, Rules and Regulations of the State of New York, and based upon the determination that conditions that may cause shellfish to be hazardous for use as food are no longer present, I, Debra A. Barnes, Chief of the Bureau of Shellfisheries of the Department of Environmental Conservation, hereby rescind the order, dated October 12, 2018, that designated particular shellfish lands as uncertified for the harvest of shellfish. This order is effective at sunrise on **Friday, October 19, 2018** and applies to the areas described below.

Accordingly, the harvest of shellfish from the following areas is permitted:

Towns of Babylon and Islip: All the normally certified areas in Great South Bay lying west of the Robert Moses causeway.

Town of Islip: All the normally certified areas in Nicoll Bay.

Town of Brookhaven: All the normally certified areas in Nicoll Bay and Patchogue Bay.

Towns of Riverhead and Southampton: All the normally certified areas in Flanders Bay.
