Also from June 10, 1916 to Jan 9, 1917, assistant surgeon, American Red Cross at Hopital Militaire T.R. 76, at Reims-Orange, France under Dr Joseph A. Blake, chief surgeon.

Evacuation Hospital # 3, to which I belonged, went overseas with the first 140,000; started and ran seven camp hospital buildings in the S.O.S.; participated in six credited Army Engagements on six different fronts; opened the first hospital in Germany with the Army of Occupation and covered more than twelve hundred miles in the course of its wanderings over France and into Germany.
