*Mr. J. S. Schulz with in his record makes  
 mention of Thomas Bourke who sailed  
 for France on Ste. Touraine in Feb. 1915 as  
 "Chauffeur in the unit known as the  
 "Foundation Flygwald" and speaks of Bourke  
 as follows - "The Touraine was set on fire by  
 a German spy three days out of Horse and continued  
 on fire until Port was reached. Bourke most efficient  
 & level headed in conducting nurses to life boats and  
 arranging for their safety and comfort."*
