Duties consisted of carrying out a certain number of seaplane patrols a day over a prescribed area. Usually, before securing position as Squadron Commander, required to fly about six hours a day. Duty to report any signs of unusual design and to keep a close watch for German "subs".

although on ³ was at the time, a German submarine sank three barges within five miles of Chatham. Seaplanes engaged but the submarine was undamaged owing to failure of bombs to function. great many many S.O.S. calls during following weeks. I went out on some of them sometimes a hundred miles out to sea.
