Commissioned Captain, Remount Division, QMC, U.S.A. July 7th 1917. At Kansas City & Fort Riley, purchasing cavalry & Artillery horses in Kansas, Missouri, Illinois & Indiana. March 1918 ordered to Camp Merritt & placed in command detachments of 19th & 35th Engineers. Took same overseas in transport "Mount Vernon" to Brest. April 1918 made Personnel Officer Remount Division QMC American Expeditionary Force at Tours. July 1918 recalled by cablegram from Washington to purchase heavy artiller horses. Returned in transport "George Washington". In command Remount Depot Camp Grant. After armistice ordered to Camp Taylor. Discharged December 4th 1918. (I am a resident of Southampton, N.Y. and pay taxes and vote here)
