I went into action June 7th, 1915 at the Belle au Woods with the 80th Co., 6th Reg. of Marines and stayed in that sector until July 15th. We then transferred to near Soissons and opened the drive on July 18th. I was wounded the following day, having my left upper arm fractured by high explosive. I was in Red Cross Hospital # 20 until Nov. 20th, then transferred to Blois, sailed for home Dec. 18th and was put on reserve Feb. 11th.

My rank was that of private. My only decoration was the fourragere Croix de Guerre awarded to our regiment.
