In case the above is not quite clear -
 James Glendinning enlisted in the Coast Guard which at that time was operated as part of the Navy. He served as "First Class Signal Quarter Master" aboard the ship "Hudson" for 1 (one) yr. He then joined the "Tank Corp of the U.S. Army" 332 Battalion Co. Co. and was made "Corporal" and served in that capacity for 11 months or until Armistice was signed.
