Arrived in France with the 82nd Division 23rd of April, 1918; was brigaded with the British in Picardy; later on was ordered to the Army General Staff College at Longres, where he received his certificate the latter part of September; was then appointed to the General Staff of the American Expeditionary Forces, being assigned to G-2 Section; served with the army until after the Armistice when he was ordered into Germany with the Army of Occupation; on January 7, 1919 was ordered to Paris as American member of the Inter-Allied Military Commission on the Rheinish Provinces; was one of the original twenty men who started the American Legion in Paris early in 1919, and has been very active in the organization since; discharged as Lt. Col. 5th of May 1919.
