Joined 11th Squadron First Day Bombardment Group at the Front in
Sept. and fought in Two Offensives.
Returned to America and became Chief of Aerial Gunnery Headquarters
in Washington, D.C.
Discharged Feb. 1919 Major Air Service Reserve Corps (Flying Status.)
