Dear Mrs. White:

There has recently been forwarded to me a clipping from one of the Southampton papers calling attention to the fact that the details of the war records of Southampton men must be forwarded to the State authorities by the end of February. I do not recall having sent in the information with reference to my service or having the matter previously called to my attention. For the purposes of this record I would state my service as follows:

Entered service at Camp Upton, New York, April 27, 1918, as a private; detailed on May 30 to attend Fourth Officers' Training Camp at Camp Custer, Michigan; thereafter and on or about July 15, transferred to Field Artillery, Officers' Training Camp at Camp Jackson, S. C. Discharged as private and commissioned 2d lieutenant of Field Artillery at Camp Jackson, S. C., on August 30, 1918 and detailed for service with Field Artillery, Replacement Depot at Camp Jackson, S. C. Assigned to duty as Acting Brigade Adjutant, 2d Brigade Field Artillery, Replacement Depot, Camp Jackson, S. C., on or about September 15, 1918. Commissioned 1st lieutenant Field Artillery on October 23, 1918. I received honorable discharge at Camp Jackson, S. C., on December 30, 1918, at which time I was attached to Headquarters, 2d Brigade, Field Artillery, Replacement Depot, Camp Jackson, S. C. as Acting Brigade Adjutant.

I trust that this will give you the information required, but if there is anything further you will need kindly advise me.
