*The Lorraine Cross, official emblem of the
79th Div U.S.A. was given by the French.*

*In all its war operations, the 79th Div. faced
the enemy in Lorraine, the province which the
U.S. was pledged to win back for France.*

*Victory, in the face of stubborn opposition crowned
the efforts of the 79th. It was only appropriate, therefore
that the 79th should have the ancient symbol of
victory, The Lorraine Cross. I am a member of Post 433.*
