NOYAC CITIZENS ADVISORY COMMITTEE

Minutes of the February 28, 2018 Meeting

The meeting of the Noyac Citizens Advisory Committee was called to order at 7:00 P.M. at the Old Noyac School House, Noyac Road, Noyac

Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag

The Minutes of the meeting of January 31, 2018 were approved.

The members discussed PSEG's proposal to replace the existing overhead utility lines along Long Beach Road and place all utility lines underground. A question was asked as to what the proposal would cost and whether PSEG will be charging all its customers for this work or just the residents in that area. Councilman Schiavoni advised the proposal is still in the preliminary phase, that no total cost has been provided by PSEG yet, and that it is most likely a special assessment district will be created with North Haven, Bay Point, Noyac and Sag Harbor residents eventually being billed for said work, the cost of which would probably be spread out over a 10-15 year period. He also stated that residents on Cliff Drive in Bay Point advised they would be willing to donate more money to the proposal. While the proposal is mostly for aesthetic reasons, PSEG has advised they will also upgrade their facilities. It was also noted that Assemblyman Fred Thiele may seek funding for the project. A question was raised as to why Noyac residents would be taxed as the service would mostly benefit Bay Point, North Haven, Sag Harbor and possibly Shelter Island, who would not be part of the assessment district. Councilman Schiavoni advised that there will be informational public hearings and the matter will go to public referendum. State funds may also be available.

The members again expressed frustration over the lack of enforcement of clearing issues at the Noyac Golf Club.

The latest concerning the East Hampton Airport was discussed. Councilman Schiavoni stated that the Village of North Haven has adopted a resolution in support of more noise controls at the East Hampton Airport. It appears more and more residents are now in favor of closing the airport altogether due to the noise and due to the recent contamination found in surrounding water supply wells.

The members asked Councilman Schiavoni for the latest update on the Sand Land sand mining operation on north side of Middle Line Highway. Councilman Schiavoni advised

that the County has tested wells in that vicinity, however the results have not yet been released.

There being no further business before the membership, the meeting was adjourned at 8:35 P.M.
