## RESCISSION OF EMERGENCY DESIGNATION OF SHELLFISH LANDS IN THE STATE OF NEW YORK AS UNCERTIFIED FOR THE HARVEST OF SHELLFISH

Pursuant to the provisions of Subdivisions 13-0307 (1) and (2) and Subdivision 13-0309 (1) of the Environmental Conservation Law and Sections 42.17 and 47.4 of Title 6 of the Official Compilation of Codes, Rules and Regulations of the State of New York, and based upon the determination that conditions that may cause shellfish to be hazardous for use as food are no longer present, I, Debra A. Barnes, Chief, Bureau of Shellfisheries of the Department of Environmental Conservation, hereby rescind the orders, dated October 4, 2022, October 5, 2022, and October 6, 2022, that designated particular shellfish lands as uncertified for the harvest of shellfish. **This order is effective at sunrise, Thursday, October 13, 2022** and applies only to the areas described below, except as described in 6NYCRR, Part 41, "Sanitary Condition of Shellfish Lands".

**Accordingly, the harvest of shellfish from the following areas is permitted:**

**Towns of Hempstead, Oyster Bay (South Shore), Babylon, and Islip:** All the normally certified areas of Hempstead Bay, East Bay, South Oyster Bay, and Great South Bay lying westerly of the northbound spans of the Robert Moses Causeway and north of Jones Beach Island.


**Town of Southold:** All the normally certified areas of Cutchogue Harbor lying north of a line extending northeast from New Suffolk Point to the northernmost point of land at Horseshoe Cove; and all the normally certified tributaries of Hog Neck Bay and Little Peconic Bay lying between Nassau Point and Cedar Beach Point.

**Towns of Southampton and East Hampton:** All the normally certified areas of Sag Harbor Cove.

**Town of East Hampton:** All the normally certified areas of Three Mile Harbor, Hog Creek, and Accabonac Harbor.
