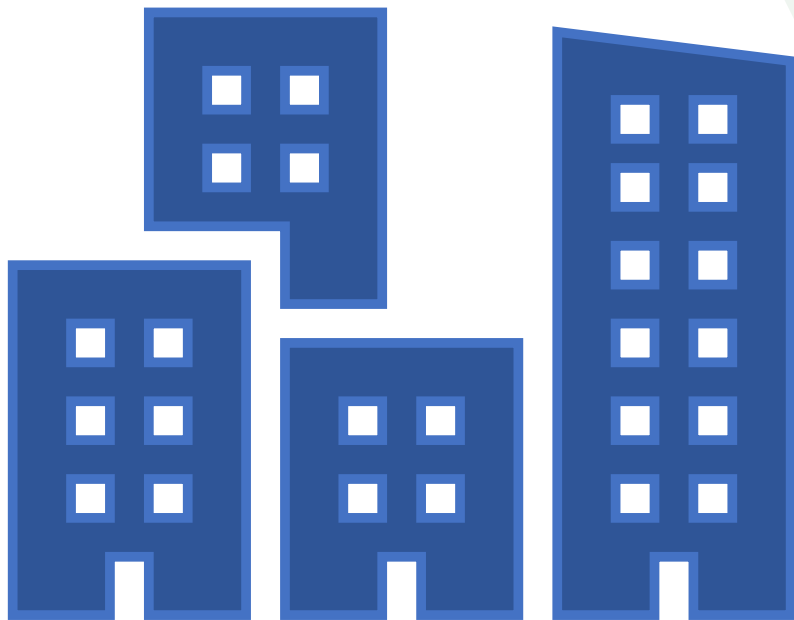

WHAT IS COMMUNITY CHOICE AGGREGATION (CCA)?

Allows municipalities to **aggregate energy demand and negotiate bulk purchase for eligible residents and small businesses**

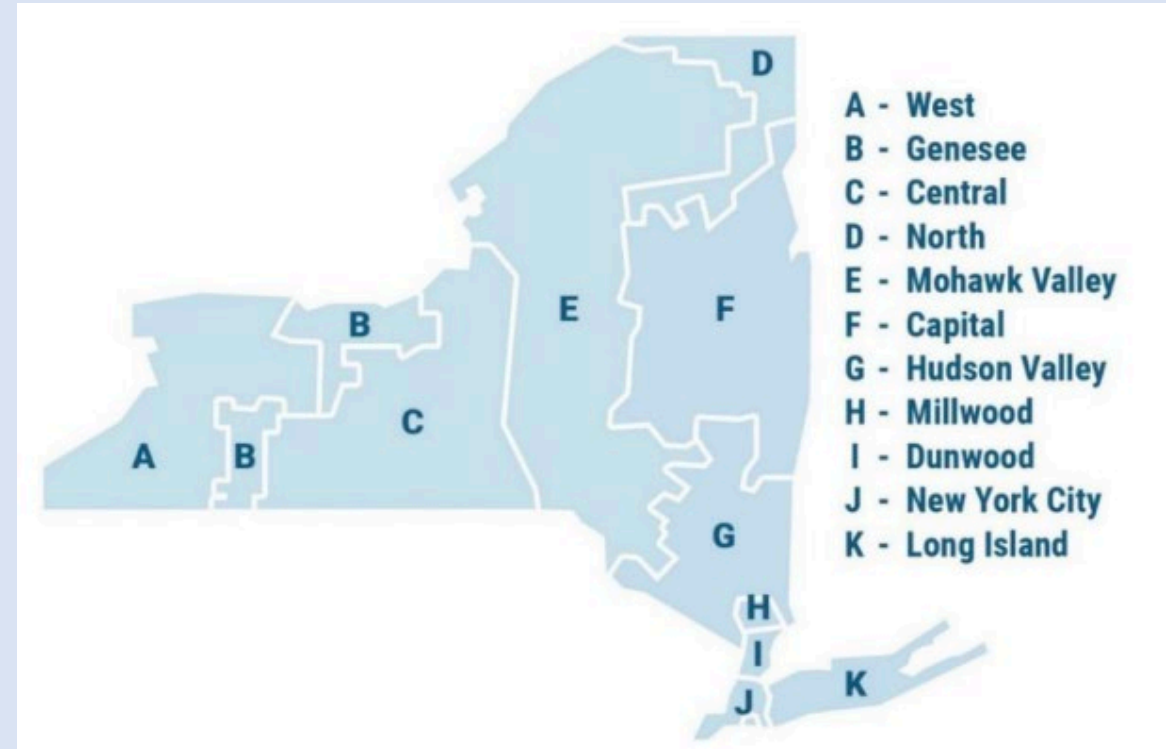

Rate 180 - Residential, General Use		<p>KWH - Kilowatt Hour - energy consumed if 1,000 watts (ex. ten 100w bulbs) are used for one hour.</p> <p>Meter Multiplier - Converts recorded use to total use on meters that are designed to only record partial use.</p> <p>Basic Service - The minimum daily cost for a 24/7 connection to the electric system.</p> <p>Delivery Service Adjustment - Effective 1/1/17 - Charge or credit applied to balance actual expenses with budgeted expenses. Creates long-term rate stability by accounting for unpredictable costs, including storm response.</p> <p>Distributed Energy Resources (DER) Charge - the cost of customer programs such as energy efficiency and conservation, as well as new technologies and methods for producing and storing energy.</p> <p>Revenue-Based PILOTS (Payments in Lieu of Taxes) - State and local taxes on utility revenues. This does not include property taxes assessed on the electric system, which make up 15% of your bill.</p> <p>Revenue Decoupling Adjustment Effective 3/1/16 - Charge or credit applied to balance actual delivery revenue with the approved revenues level. Encourages energy efficiency by breaking utility dependency on sales revenue.</p> <p>NY State Assessment - Assessment imposed on all utilities and collected on behalf of the State.</p> <p>Suffolk Property Tax Adjustment - The amount collected by PSEGIL from Suffolk County customers representing the overpayment of property taxes to the Shoreham taxing jurisdictions from a court-ordered legal settlement dated January 11, 2000.</p> <p>Sales Tax - State and/or local sales taxes.</p>

What is Community Choice Aggregation (CCA)?

Shifts the selection of the default supplier from the state (the utility) to your local municipality

- allows for the default choice to support renewable energy
- competitive rates

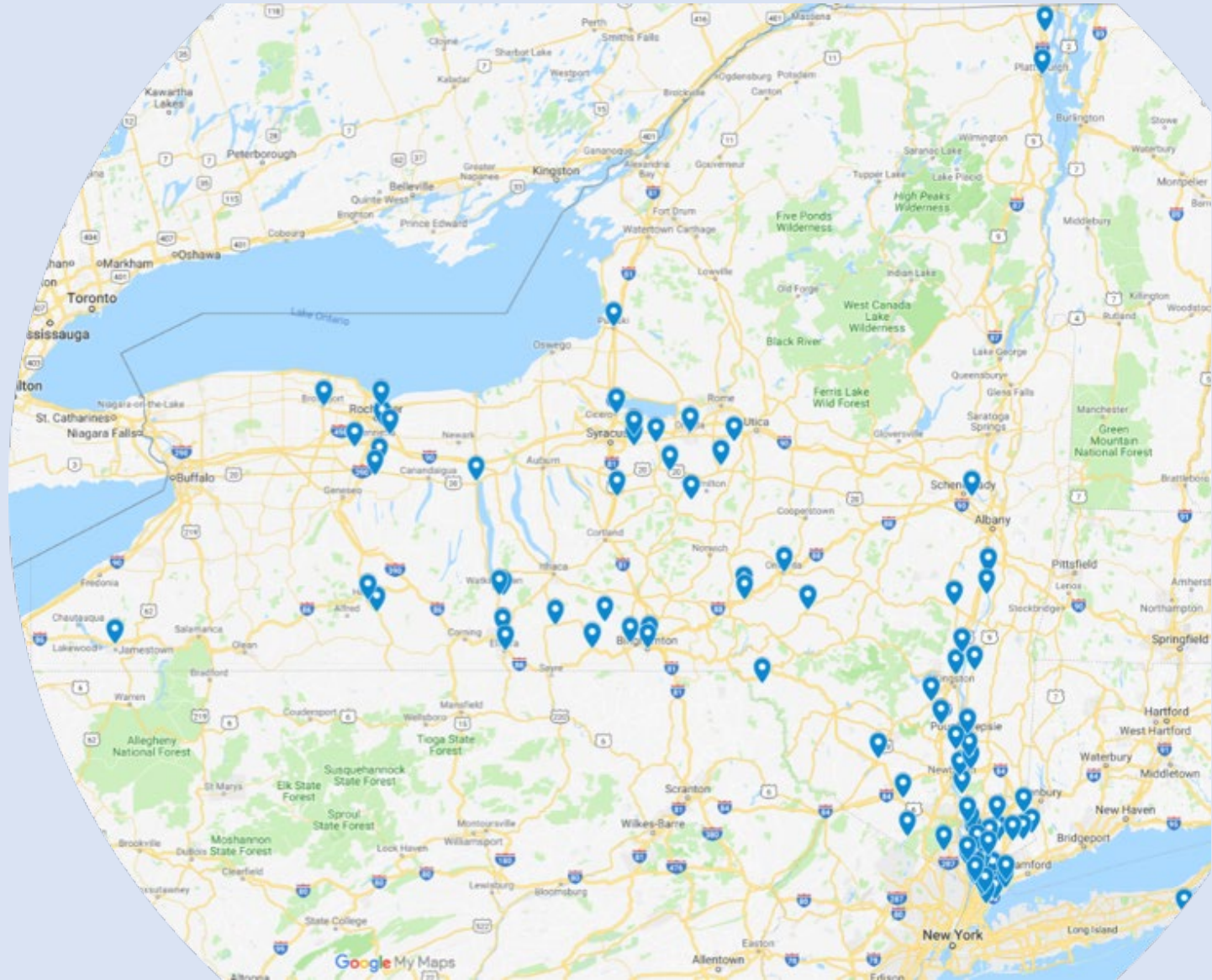
CCA, an energy purchase program, authorized by the Public Service Commission in April 2016



CCA in New York State

From July 2021 to June 2022,
NY CCAs have:

- Saved \$28.79 million dollars
- Served 257,047 customers across 64 municipalities
- Generated 1,515,497 MWh of renewable energy



Renewable Electricity Supply Benefits for Participants

- At least 50% Renewable Electricity as default
- Cost saving opportunity
- No individual contracts
- No exit fees at any time
- Strong consumer protection

Role of PSEG Long Island

With CCA, PSEG Long Island continues to:

- Deliver electricity
- Repair & maintain lines
- Bill customers

Who is Automatically Enrolled?

Most PSEG Long Island customers are eligible to participate. Those eligible are automatically enrolled in the program and can opt-out at any time.

Eligible customers are enrolled on an opt-out basis except for....

Not Automatically Enrolled

- Customers already contracted with a third-party electricity supplier/ESCO
- Customers with block on their account
- Home Energy Assistance Program (HEAP) recipients

How Will CCA Affect Me?

Eligible customers will be **automatically enrolled unless they take action** before the program begins, by phone, pre-paid opt-out card or website form.



TIMELINE DETAILS

All eligible customers receive info packet

- **Fall 2023**
- Explains benefits, terms, conditions, provides opt-out options, & includes FAQ

30-day initial opt-out period

- **Fall 2023**, but anyone can opt-out at any time during the program, with no exit fees

Launch

- Selected default supply for every municipality
- Program rate on PSEG Long Island bill beginning first meter-read in **Winter 2024**
(new supplier identified on bill)

Frequently Asked Questions

- **Does this program replace my utility company?**

No. You continue to pay your utility bill and your utility remains responsible for delivery and maintenance of the electrical grid and billing.

- **Does this impact the reliability of my electricity?**

No, your utility continues to deliver your electricity and provides the same service whether you participate in the program or not.

Frequently Asked Questions

- **Will this program save me money?**

Savings are not guaranteed.

- **What if I want to change my supply choice?**

Once the program launches, you may call the helpline or fill out the Enrollment/Change form on website to change your supply selection, opt-out, or opt back into the program, with no fees or penalties

Frequently Asked Questions

- **Do I have to stay in the program the entire time?**

No, you may opt-out or opt back in at any time with no fees or penalties.

- **Can I participate if I have my own solar panels or if I participate in community solar?**

Yes, even if you use solar power, you are still required to have a supplier on your utility bill to cover any electricity not provided by your solar.

- **What happens when the program ends?**

When the contract ends, your municipality may choose to renew participation in the program. If not, you will automatically switch back to your utility selecting your supply on your behalf.
