EMERGENCY DESIGNATION OF SHELLFISH LANDS IN THE STATE OF NEW YORK AS UNCERTIFIED FOR THE HARVEST OF SHELLFISH


Pursuant to the provisions of Subdivisions 13-0307 (1) and (2) and Subdivision 13-0309 (1) of the Environmental Conservation Law and Section 42.17 and 47.4 of Title 6 of the Official Compilation of Codes, Rules and Regulations of the State of New York, and due to the extremely heavy rainfall and extraordinary amounts of stormwater runoff and localized street flooding associated with the rainfall event of July 9-10, 2023 which may result in conditions causing shellfish to be hazardous for use as food, I, Katharine Petronis, Deputy Commissioner of Natural Resources of the Department of Environmental Conservation, hereby designate the shellfish lands described below as **UNCERTIFIED effective immediately on July 10, 2023** and continuing until a determination is made that water quality in the affected areas meets the criteria for certified shellfish lands.

Accordingly, it is unlawful to harvest shellfish from the following areas:

- 1. Towns of Brookhaven and Southampton:** All that area of Moriches Bay and Narrow Bay lying east of the Smith's Point Bridge and lying west of a line extending from the southernmost point of Speonk Point to the northernmost point of Gunning Point.
