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RESCISSION OF EMERGENCY DESIGNATION OF SHELLFISH LANDS IN THE STATE OF NEW YORK AS UNCERTIFIED FOR THE HARVEST OF SHELLFISH

Pursuant to the provisions of Subdivisions 13-0307 (1) and (2) and Subdivision 13-0309 (1) of the Environmental Conservation Law and Sections 42.17 and 47.4 of Title 6 of the Official Compilation of Codes, Rules and Regulations of the State of New York, and based upon the determination that conditions that may cause shellfish to be hazardous for use as food are no longer present, I, Debra A. Barnes, Chief, Bureau of Shellfisheries of the Department of Environmental Conservation, hereby rescind specific sections of the order dated January 10, 2024, that designated particular shellfish lands as uncertified for the harvest of shellfish. **This order is effective at 12:00 PM EST, Thursday, January 18, 2024**, and applies only to the areas described below, except as described in 6NYCRR, Part 41, "Sanitary Condition of Shellfish Lands".

Accordingly, the harvest of shellfish from the following areas is permitted:

- 1. Town of Brookhaven (North Shore):** All the normally certified areas of Mt. Sinai Harbor and its tributaries.
- 2. Town of Shelter Island:** All the normally certified areas of West Neck Harbor, Coecles Harbor, Crab Creek, and all the creeks, coves, bays, and harbors lying between Wards Point and Majors Point.
- 3. Town of Southold:** All the normally certified areas of Great Peconic Bay and its tributaries.
- 4. Town of Southampton:** All the normally certified areas of North Sea Harbor including its tributaries and Wooley Pond.
